# High level of survey participation

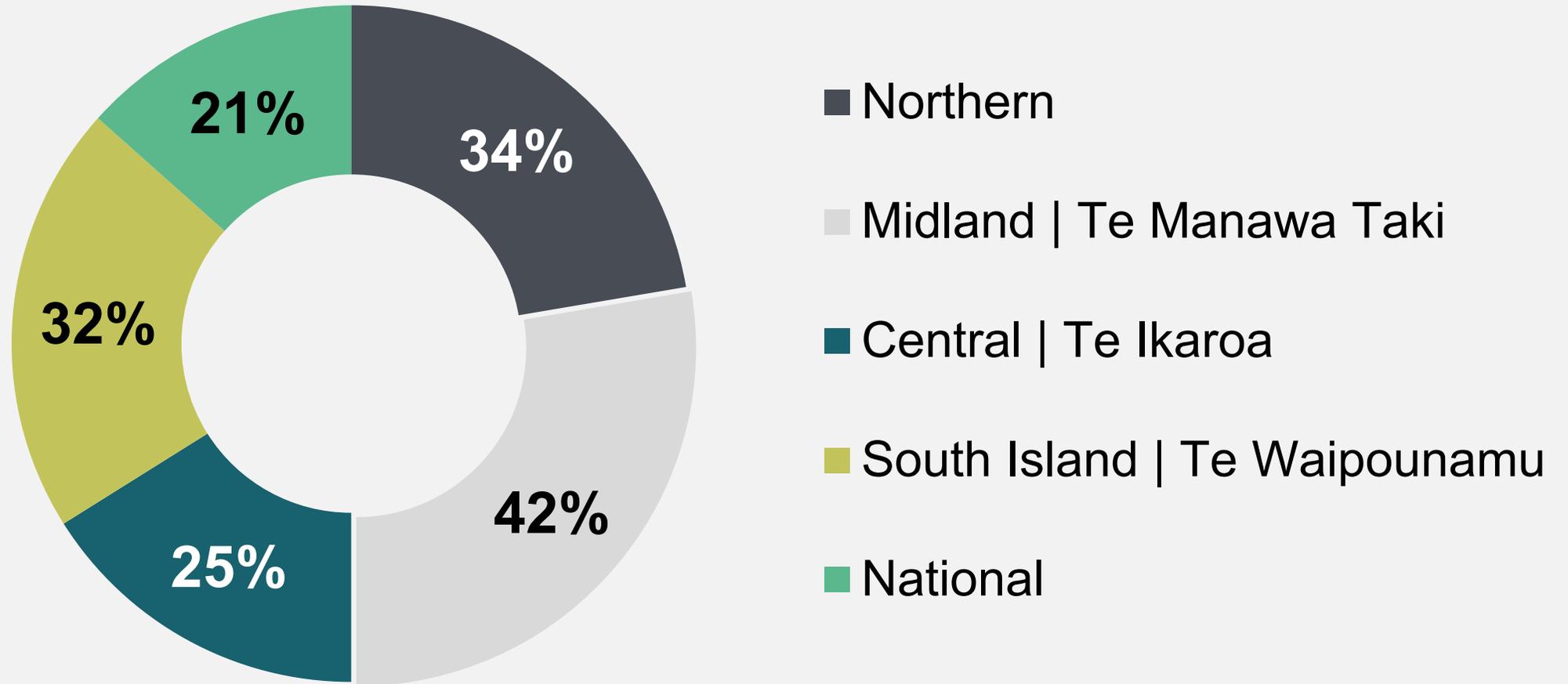
**200+** mental health & addiction NGOs

**74** organisations took part in survey

# Range of NGOs shared their thoughts

## Organisation type\*

- 19 Kaupapa Māori
- 12 lived experience-led NGOs
- 4 Pasifika
- 40 Mainstream

## Main service

- 15 addiction only
- 30 mental health only
- 15 mental health and addiction
- 11 others eg housing, health & social services

## Organisation size

- 7 very small - under 5 FTEs
- 14 small - 5 to 19 FTEs
- 15 medium - 20 to 49 FTEs
- 37 large - 50 or more FTEs

## Age groups\*

- 39 infant, child and/or youth
- 70 adults
- 49 older adults

# Shared barriers & enablers across providers

Key enablers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Integrating tools in electronic records (88%)</li> <li>• App/tablet to collect (75%)</li> <li>• Tools quick &amp; easy to use (75%)</li> <li>• Training in outcome tools (75%)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tools quick and easy to use (60%)</li> <li>• Integrating tools in electronic records (57%)</li> <li>• Training in outcome tools (53%)</li> <li>• Relevant outcome tools (53%)</li> </ul>

Community of Practice	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 16/19 answered</li><li>• Some level of interest (75%)</li><li>• Mostly with certain terms and conditions</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 48/57 answered</li><li>• Some level of interest (88%)</li><li>• Mostly very interested</li></ul>
Conditions for national approach, eg PRIMHD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 16/19 answered</li><li>• 3 organisations don't support</li><li>• Data sovereignty principles (81%)</li><li>• NGO ownership of data (56%)</li><li>• Robust, secure data infrastructure (38%)</li><li>• PRIMHD data collection time consuming, could be simpler</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 49/57 answered</li><li>• NGO data ownership (47%)</li><li>• Data insights for NGOs (47%)</li><li>• Robust, secure data infrastructure (45%)</li><li>• Consent for use/reuse (45%)</li><li>• Investment to support</li></ul>
